Meeting called to order by Paul Muth at 7:08 pm. Jason seconded.

Minutes from June were approved by Paul and Angela seconded.

The Treasurer's report for June was read and approved. Paul motioned and Jason seconded.

- The balance on the sign post was paid out as 869.58.

Business

- Landscaping bids have not been received, as companies are not responding. Paul suggested that nothing should be planted until the fall. Kevin will reach out to other companies to get bids for proposed future work.
- Kevin has received information about the proposed road widening in front of the neighborhood. McCraney confirmed that the project is set for 2026.
- Tony brought forth a bill for placing the barriers blocking exit from the school into Moorland. As of the meeting there has been no response from any person of JCPS.
- The street lights, believed to be six total, are still out. Angela opened a ticket and was told that LG&E would be out but a week later they have not been addressed. Clerk will open another ticket and possibly other residents will as well.
- Discussed two residents with debris obstructing sidewalks. A letter will be sent to these residents, both on Farnham.
- Paul apologized for not fixing the concrete around the hydrant on Claremoor that he stated he would fix. Commissioners discussed that MSD or Louisville Water are responsible and that the board will attempt to have one of the companies to repair.
- Discussion on the easement commenced. A resident on Ashmoor put their debris over the fence into the neighbor's yard. A letter will go to all Ashmoor residents that back up to the easement to notify them it is illegal to dump debris into their neighbors private property. Residents brought forth concern over cut debris that is in easement blocking allowance for mowing easement. Tony will bring a bid price to remove the debris, allowing mowing to commence. Property owners that do not maintain their property in the easement will start to be fined.
- A new budget has been proposed, voting on the new budget will happen next month.

Paul motioned to adjourn the meeting and Kevin seconded. Meeting adjourned at 8:13 PM
