### Budget

## **New Business**

### Mayor and council members resign

- Mayor, Dave Chervenak, announced his plans to resign as mayor in September 2021 due to health concerns. Dwight Grammer and Gail Nall also announced their plans to resign in September.
- Board discussed a plan to engage Moorland residents and encourage them to join the council- Clerk will send a letter to each resident and will post to social media.
- Board discussed possible plans to continue paying for Rumpke and LG&E as well as landscaping and other maintenance.
- Board members will: Write to the Secretary of State and County Clerk, call Frankfort contacts regarding the city's money if there is no functioning government, find out if services can be paid for in advance.
- Board noted that the city could be dissolved and possibly absorbed by Lyndon, but it is a year-long process requiring a council to achieve it.
- Board noted that the city will dissolve automatically if there is no government for 1 year.

Dwight motioned to adjourn the meeting. Gail seconded.
