Meeting called to order by Paul Muth at 7:01 pm, Jason seconded.

Minutes from February were approved by Paul and Kevin seconded.

The Treasurer's report for February was read and approved. Paul motioned and Jason seconded. Checks were signed.

Insurance due at the end of March and Barbara will get other quotes to compare.

Business

- There has been no response from Bowen regarding the closure of the exit through the neighborhood.
- Paul attended the zoning meeting for the Perkin home. Three issues were brought forth but only one passed, the provision for fencing to be 6ft. The side yard is also considered the front yard. The outdoor kitchen was not approved.
- Paul received two bids for the clearing of the easement on Claremoor. The board voted for Tony to do the work. A letter will be sent to all residents with an MSD easement about the upcoming clearing. Residents will also be informed to remove fences if they are in place, as they are against the city ordinance and if the city has to remove them the bill will be sent to the resident.
- Paul attempted to get multiple estimates for the sidewalk repair. Some said it was too small of a project and another never would send the estimate. The sidewalk on Brentmoor will be repaired by tony for \$2800. Paul motioned and all commissioners approved.
- The city wide yard sale will be June 1st. Paul motioned and Kevin approved.
- A resident brought up the work across the train tracks and the possibilities of it being the water lines moved back for the intersection expansion.
- Kevin brought forth the issue that the Louisville Water Company asked for proof of the damage and work at the entrance that damages the road. Paul will reach out to David, the former Mayor, to get as much information as possible so that the city can get LWC to pay for the repairs.
- Paul agreed to continue to mow the entrance for free. He asked for approval to rent a power seeder and grass seed for the front entrance, all commissioners voted to approve.
- Signs for the dead end street have not been installed. Angela will reach out to Safety Co.
- Paul has talked to owners of the apartment buildings and found that Rumpke has picked up the yard waste bags. He reached out to Rumpke. One owner with the large pothole in the parking lot stated that she will handle it when healed from illness.
- Paul brought forth the concerns of the effects of the ruling for the Capital Gains case in the Supreme Court.
- Jessie resigned from the board officially and the board will be looking for a replacement.
- Tony brought up the need to mulch the front entrance bushes. Pallets of Cypress mulch are now over \$1500. The board discussed switching to hardwood, which is better landscape and would be cheaper getting scoops. Paul stated it would be more than he is willing to do for free and Tiny agreed to bid the project.

Paul motioned to adjourn the meeting and Kevin seconded. Meeting adjourned at 7:45 PM
